In order to offer something in AFDS, hold up a white piece of paper next to your face, wait to be called upon, unmute your microphone and speak. When done, re-mute your microphone, so that others don't hear feedback and sounds from your home (you'd be surprised how they carry!)

Everyone's microphone will be automatically muted when they enter the Zoom online 'room'. The Clerk will facilitate by welcoming everyone by name as they enter the site, so that you will know your technology is working and you are 'seen'. The Clerk will also indicate verbally when Friends are expected to settle into silence and begin worship, as well as ending the worship at the appointed time, and inviting joys and sorrows.
